From the Director

ACC's State Opioid Response (SOR) grant, which provides funding for the Medication Assisted Treatment program, had been extended through June of 2021. The grant had been slated to end in September of this year. The grant pays for Vivitrol, a medication used in the treatment of opioid disorder, and comes with Grant Coordinator and Substance Abuse Program Leader positions.

Area 5 Agent Felix Jackson received a Letter of Accommodation and a Challenge Coin from Area Manager Wendi Phillips and Assistant Area Manager Hope Smith for taking control of a situation in the Fort Smith office that was vexing while maintaining a calm and professional approach. It began in mid-July when an offender doing community service at the Fort Smith office became stuck in the building's elevator. The offender had apparently been vacuuming and had entered the elevator to vacuum when the doors shut behind her, the vacuum cord became lodged in the door and the offender was trapped. Jackson spoke with the offender and made attempts to free her, including cutting the cord to the vacuum, but staff eventually had to call the fire department to help. The fire department was able to free the offender who was not hurt during the incident.





In late July, Agent Cody Cassell and Officer Jimmy Carter, of the Mountain View Parole & Probation Office, conducted a warrantless search of an offender's vehicle which smelled of marijuana, and discovered marijuana and methamphetamine (pictured below). The offender was arrested.



The East Central Center (ECC) in West Memphis has a praise dance team of residents who assist in the worship services at the center. When asked what the praise dance team meant to them, residents shared their thoughts:

"To us, praise dance is more than a performance done on Sundays at church. To us, praise dance is our ministry. It is our way to express our love and gratitude for the One who created us and loved us enough to send His only son to die on the cross for our sins. Intensive Parole Supervision team received a tip that an offender was standing on his front porch brandishing a gun and started an investigation at the offender's home that resulted in the confiscation of a Winchester 7mm rifle and ammunition. Also discovered was a bag of collectible coins and a social security card belonging to another individual.



A Memorial was placed in the administrative wing at the Central Arkansas Center in Little Rock in honor of Richard Richardson who passed away earlier this spring from COVID-19. Richardson, a treatment coordinator at the facility and a high school and college football player, was the first state employee to succumb to the virus. He is missed.



Area 8's

ECC's Assistant Warden Phillip Glover and his wife supplied barbeque, chips, lemonade, dessert and goodie baskets to the staff who worked on the Fourth of July holiday.

Area 8 (Pulaski County) Agents Roderick McGruder and Violet White conducted a home visit and discov-

ered a Taurus .380 caliber handgun with a round in the chamber, and three additional rounds in the magazine. A search of the offender's car revealed .08 grams of marijuana and a digital scale.



IPS agents in Area 8 also received information that an offender was at the Days Inn on Fair Park in Little Rock and was involved in narcotic activities. IPS investigated and found a 30 grams of fentanyl, .2 grams of heroin, .02 grams of meth, and \$2,789 (see below). The offender was booked in on new charges at the Pulaski County Jail.



IPS Agents Ryan Gordon and Violet White discovered marijuana and methamphetamine at an offender's home in Little Rock. The offender, an absconder, was taken in to custody and faces new charges.

Each month during graduation for the residents, Central Arkansas Center (CAC) treatment staff recognize the Most Improved Resident and Resident of the Month. For July, Resident Herrin who is a Coordinator was Resident of the Month and Resident Waggoner was recognized as Most Improved.



The Northwest Center in Fayetteville (NWC) held a Dress for Success fashion show helping residents understand what is acceptable wear in a working/business situation versus what is not appropriate work attire.




Agents from ACC's Intensive Parole Supervision team and Special Response Team joined with Little Rock Police to investigate a tip that an absconder was at a hotel in West Little Rock. The combined team found the absconder in question in addition to a second absconder. Both were arrested and 10 grams of meth, 14 grams of marijuana, six grams MDMA (Ecstasy) and a digital scale were confiscated.

Residents at the Northwest Center (NWC) have successfully grown vegetables in their garden that has been used in preparing meals at the center.



Throughout the pandemic the Arkansas Northeastern College staff has worked hard to help Northeast Center (NEC) residents continue to further their education and obtain their GED certification. During July, one resident achieved this goal and many more started the path by taking their GED readiness test.



In mid-July, Sex Offender Treatment and Intervention Scale (SOTIPS) training was held for sex offender officers working out of Area 2: Haley Farmer, Jeffrey Baumgardner, and Jimmy Carter. The implementation of SOTIPS assessment for sex offenders is a pilot for Area 2. Initial training is considered complete and assessment of sex offenders with SOTIPS will soon begin.

Treatment Program Summary:

826 Probationers and Parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment Programs. Additionally 1,310 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment Programs, bringing the total served to 2,136.

460 residents have agreed to participate in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018; 176 are discharged with follow up in progress in the community; and 32 have completed the program. Partnership is in effect with 56 community providers to continue MAT upon release from ACC centers.

Telehealth services began July 2019 and are currently active in 14 locations.

General Treatment Program Summary (Non-Drug Court):

Substance Use Disorder Treatment - 568 participants
Case Management - 75 participants
Continuing Care - 159 participants
Domestic Violence Prevention - 10 participants
Life Skills - 25 participants
Tobacco Use Treatment Groups - 8 participants

Two participants graduated from the Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Program (COAP) and both rated the telehealth services a 10 and a 9 on a scale of 1 to 10.

As of July 31, ACC has 7 licensed reentry facilities with 218 total residents currently in Phases I-IV of the reentry facility program with 36 reentry graduates during the month.

16 new residents were transferred into the reentry program with one starting GED classes.

16 reentry facility residents received their driver's license, 7 received an ID card, 16 received their social security card and 12 received birth certificates.

In July, 160 facility residents were reported to be employed and 11 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry officers conducted 234 reentry facility office visits, 223 Phase IV office visits, 65 Phase IV home visits, 95 pre-parole plan verifications and 77 community contacts.

ACC has funded 467 residents within 19 licensed transitional living facilities. Of that number, 257 have obtained full-time employment.

This month, four residents reported to have enrolled in GED classes and two enrolled in a vo-tech program.

A total of 19 residents received their driver's license, 138 received an ID card, 105 received their social security card and 24 received birth certificates. During July, seven volunteers worked with ACC and 303 volunteer hours from faith-based programs, mentors and interns were recorded.

There are approximately 835 service providers registered in Good Grid, a total of 67,124 supervision accounts and 12,245 inmate registered accounts. This month, 69 inmates and 507 supervision accounts were registered on The Good Grid.

During the month there were approximately 642 individuals were screened for the Arkansas Works program. There were 501 individuals who submitted application and 876 who enrolled in a "Qualified Health Plan" as reported by Eaton Agency.

There are 207 offenders connected to a recovery coach.

Specialty Court: These officers supervise offenders in specialty courts. Note that these officers may also carry regular P&P offenders, and these offenders are reflected in the specialty court caseload/workload figures; however, separate caseload/workload ratios are calculated for the regular and specialty court portions of a specialty court officer's caseload, in addition to a combined, or mixed, ratio.

Specialized: These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (intensive supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Special Response Team).

Indirect: These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in non-reporting status, those on suspended sentences (SIS), and interstate compact offenders. Offenders on annual supervision are also included in this group.


