From the Director

ACC has modified daily operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Division of Community Correction has made changes to daily operations to



limit contact between employees, offenders and the public from possible exposure to COVID-19. In field services, examples include the In-Touch App, which has allowed offenders to report remotely to their supervising officers without the risk of physical exposure. Treatment staff are providing

individual counseling over the phone to offenders in lieu of group counseling and supervision fees have been waived for the month of April 2020 to lessen the burden on offenders who are currently unemployed. On the residential side, visitation has been temporarily stopped to protect residents at the centers from exposure to COVID-19 and medical co-pays have been waived for the residents at this time.

Saving lives and finding drugs and firearms were all part of the job for officers in Area 2 during February.

Officer Hunter Boles and Agent Josh Morehead of the Melbourne office, along with officers of the 16th Judicial District Drug Task Force and Izard



County Sheriff's Office, conducted a home compliance check and found two firearms (including a shotgun loaded with a slug), a crystallized substance believed to be methamphetamine and items of drug paraphernalia were discovered. The offender and two other individuals were taken into custody without incident.



A late-night call out to a nearby offender's home had Officer Shaun Wiseman, of the Harrison office, and Newton County Deputy Sheriff Chase Smith working to help an offender who had been shot in the shoulder and was steadily losing blood. He was showing initial signs of going into shock, but was still able to tell them who had shot him and a brief version of what had happened as they began working on him to try and stop the bleeding.

Deputy Smith and Officer Wiseman both opened their first aid kits and, after receiving verbal consent to do so, went about cutting through the pullover and T-shirt that the offender was wearing. Officer Wiseman made note of an entrance and exit wound through the shirt on his left shoulder, approximately two inches below his left clavicle. At this point, the offender was complaining of being thirsty and his complexion had gone pale and he began to sweat. His speech had become slightly slurred and Deputy Smith and Officer Wiseman took turns asking him questions to try and keep him conscious. They applied gauze and put pressure on his shoulder, the pain seemingly bringing him back into focus. They kept pressure on for nearly 20 minutes until the ambulance arrived and took over.

Agent Ben Lockard, of the Mountain View office, assisted by the Stone County Sheriff's Department, conducted a home visit and discovered items used in the distribution of illegal drugs and more than 40 grams of methamphetamine.

In late February, the Malvern Parole and Probation Office (Area 10) hosted the Drug Endangered Children Collaborative Intervention Network meeting which was attended by 25 officials from ACC, Hot Spring County Sheriff's Department, Malvern Police Department, Magnet Cove School, Malvern School, Bismarck School and the Department of Human Services.



A home visit in Sheridan (Area 10) resulted in an

offender being arrested on charges of possession of a controlled substance with purpose to deliver, possession of drug paraphernalia, maintaining a drug premises, unauthorized use of another person's property to facilitate a crime, and endangering the welfare of a minor after drugs and a BB gun were found in the home.

A federal indictment will be sought against a sex offender who was caught attempting to make a sexual connection with a 14-year-old child in the north central part of the state. Agent Michelle Earnhart assisted the Jonesboro Police Department – Internet Crimes Against Children, the Arkansas State Police, and Homeland Security in the arrest.


Agent Paul Kirkdoffer conducted a polygraph examination on and discovered he had sexual encounters with numerous people after meeting them on social media sites and possessing nude photos - all in violation of his parole. The digital evidence is being processed by the Arkansas Attorney General's ICAC Team for suspected child pornography.

Career Planning and Placement Specialist (CPPS) Becky Hutchison assisted in a job Fair in the Clarksville Office (Area 5). Greg Bodiford with the Arkansas Workforce Center did an excellent job and had all offenders talking by the end of the event. Rick Charles a recruiting assistant with Census Bureau spoke about jobs needed with the 2020 census and provided hiring packets. CPPS Paula Cox assisted



in a job fair at the Booneville Office. Eight attended the Job Skills class taught by Bodiford.

Division of Community Correction Parole and Probation Officer Stephanie Wofford and Agent Tiffany Razer (Area 4) were honored to volunteer for



a Special Olympics Basketball Skills event at the Blytheville High School. ACC Officers teamed up with the Blytheville Police Department, Arkansas State Police and the Mississippi County Sheriff's



Office to assist the participants in the events and award bronze, silver and gold medals to all competitors.

Residents at the Northeast Center in Osceola are spending time each day preparing the garden area for spring planting which will occur when ordered seeds arrive.

TEC Staffing held a Job Fair in the Conway office (Area 6) for offenders seeking employment and needing assistance with resume' writing.

The Pine Bluff Parole and Probation office (Area 11) held a clothes giveaway for the offenders who report to the Pine Bluff office. Offenders were allowed to take whatever items they wanted. The clothes for the giveaway were donated items. One offender's home had just burned the day before and she lost everything. She was able to replace much needed clothing items for herself and her family.



During a home visit Agent Dustin Parker and Agent Brooke Williams discovered numerous homemade methamphetamine smoking pipes and six plastic baggies with a white powdery residue believed to be methamphetamine. Agents contacted the Cleveland County Sheriff's Department and local authorities took over the investigation. Both the offender and his wife



were arrested and charged with felony possession of drug paraphernalia. The offender's six-year-old son was in the home and in a room with the locat-

ed items. A report was made to the Arkansas Child Abuse Hotline and an investigation was opened.

Area 11 Agents Erik Thomas and Terri Rogers and Officer Tim Sivils conducted a home visit and found a firearm hidden in an offender's bedroom.

Agent Steve Simers, of the Salem office, and Officer Hayley Farmer, of the Mountain Home (both Area 2) office gave a presentation to a group of students at the Mammoth Spring School regarding "Sexting." Officer Farmer spoke concerning the applicable laws and the possible long-term legal consequences and dangers in participating in this type of activity, while Agent Simers focused on discussing how events in a persons' present life will influence their future endeavors. Agent Simers was quoted as saying, "Where you are today effects where you will be tomorrow." There was also time for a question and answer session after the presentation. Although it is a difficult subject to discuss, both Officer Farmer and Agent Simers did an excellent job of presenting this information to the group.

Assistant Area Manager Eva Frame met with Twin Lakes Literacy Council Representative Heather Pow-

ell who said she would be willing to train six offenders who could then be used to tutor offenders in the areas of reading and writing. Offenders who volunteer for this will make a six month commitment to tutor other offenders once a week for six months. They will obtain a certificate and will have the opportunity to help continue working with the Literacy Council in the future if they so choose. The training to be a tutor would be seven hours. AAM Frame has volunteered to attend that training and act as back-up in case no tutors reported. All training and tutoring would occur at the

Mountain Home office.

Agent McGruder and Agent White conducted a home

visit in Area 8 (Pulaski County) and found a gun in the offender's shoe. The firearm was identified as a .22 caliber Phoenix Arms semi automatic. There were 6 rounds in the magazine and one in the chamber. The offender was taken into custody.

Treatment Summary:

1,514 Probationers and Parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment Programs. Additionally 1,584 Participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment Programs, bringing the total served to 3,098.

A total of 403 residents have agreed to participate in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018; 146 are discharged with follow up in progress in the community; and 16 have completed the program. Partnership is in effect with 53 Community Providers to continue MAT upon release.

Reentry

As of February, ACC has 8 licensed reentry facilities with 286 total residents currently in Phase I-IV of the Reentry Facility Program with 57 reentry graduates this month.

During the month, 50 new residents were transferred into the reentry program, 14 resident started GED classes, 27 residents enrolled in Career Readiness Classes (CRC), 10 residents started WAGE, 2 residents completed WAGE and 10 residents received their Career Readiness Certificate.

A total of 32 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 32 received an ID card, 52 received their SS card and 12 received birth certificates.

Reentry Officers:

In February, there were 235 employment event referrals reported, 180 facility residents were reported to be employed and 50 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported 19 education referrals that resulted in an education enrollment. During the month, Reentry Officers helped coordinate 34 reentry events that targeted barriers for reentry

Transitional Housing:

A total of 19 licensed facilities with 577 beds (562 ACC funded residents) in the facilities.

Within the transitional facilities there are a total of 289 residents who have obtained full time employment.

This month, 24 residents reported to have enrolled in

GED classes, 19 residents enrolled in WAGE, 6 completed WAGE, 19 residents enrolled in CRC and 1 resident completed their CRC certification. There is a total of 37 registered sex offenders living in the transitional facilities.

A total of 14 residents received their driver's license ,63 received an ID card, 60 received their Social Security card and 14 received birth certificates.

A total of 77 graduated the transitional housing program.

ACC Reentry Coaches provided referrals to 89 individuals who were released out on parole in the month of February—those referrals include Celebrate Recovery, Good Grid, local food pantries, Goodwill Resource centers, and AA/NA meetings.

There are approximately 520 service providers registered in Good Grid, a total of 65,806 supervision accounts and 14,282 inmate accounts. There are currently 2,110 visible resumes. This month, 100 inmates and 572 supervision accounts were registered on The Good Grid.

During the month there were approximately 1,630 individuals were screened for the Arkansas Works program. There were a total 1,280 individuals who submitted application and 857 who enrolled in a "Qualified Health Plan" as reported by Eaton Agency.


