
Community service workers and the **Area 8** Parole and Probation Office collected 508 pounds of cereal for the annual cereal drive held each summer in Little Rock. LaShunda O'Brien and Assistant Area Manager Debra James are responsible for guiding and helping



the workers collect the cereal which was delivered to the Arkansas Food Bank in late June.

The Saline County Circuit Court and ACC Drug Court staff in **Area 10** hosted a pizza party and graduation ceremony for those offenders who completed Drug Court during the COVID-19 pandemic. Judge Ken Casady provided encouragement to past and present Drug Court members. Recent graduates described the positive changes Drug Court had brought to their lives.

Career Planning and Placement Specialist Paula Cox loaded up a group of community service workers from the Mena office in **Area 5** and worked on cleaning up the area around the Mena City Animal Pound. Mena expressed thanks for ACC's community service workers and for CPPS Paula Cox. She also took a group of community service workers to a local cemetery in Fort Smith. **Area 5** has adopted this cemetery as the City of Fort Smith has had a hard time finding workers to spend time cleaning this area.



Area 2 Agent Nick Mayfield took three offenders to pick up litter along State Highway 178 as it stretches from the Mountain Home city limit to State Highway 126. The four mile stretch of highway was very well patrolled for litter and several bags were collected.


The Work of Parole/Probation Officers and Agents

Area 10 Parole/Probation Officer Richard Perry and Agent Courtney Cooper arrested a Hope Court of-

fender who attempted to flee on foot from custody. The offender was detained a short distance from the Saline County Court House after he tripped and a concerned by-stander encouraged him to stop running and give up.

Area 10 Agent Randy Zimmerman conducted a home visit in Grapevine with the assistance of a Garland County Sheriff's Deputy and discovered drug paraphernalia in the offender's home. The offender was taken into custody.

Area 5 Parole/Probation Officers Chad Davis and Cherie Smith conducted a home visit in Cove with assistance from Drug Task Force and Polk County Sheriff personnel and found methamphetamine and heroin along with drug paraphernalia. Two offenders were taken into custody. Items found are shown at right.




Area 2 Agent Steve Simers was in route to the Mountain Home Office when a call came over the Fulton County Sheriff's Department radio indicating that there was an unresponsive male subject in a running vehicle on a county road near Viola. Fulton County was short-handed



and the officers on duty were in another location in the county which was a fair distance from the subject's location. Agent Simers advised that he was near the area

and would stop and check on the subject. Upon arrival Agent Simers observed a male subject who was asleep in the driver's seat of a vehicle with the engine running. Agent Simers identified the subject as a probation absconder with active warrants. Agent Simers was able to wake the man and conducted a pat down search for officer safety. Agent Simers observed a small, black zippered container on the armrest of the offender's vehicle which upon further investigation contained one small pink pill, a set of digital scales with a white residue, two plastic baggies containing a white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine, and a small plastic baggie containing a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana. Further investigation of the vehicle's console resulted in the discovery of another small plastic baggie containing a white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine. The offender was taken into custody by Fulton County Sheriff's deputies. The crystalline substance later weighed in at 3.64 grams.

Numerous guns were found during a home visit in Pine Bluff (**Area 11**) including 3 guns with loaded magazines and empty clips. The Pine Bluff Police Department's Crime Scene Unit was contacted, pictures taken, and weapons were bagged as evidence and taken into custody. Charges are expected to be filed.



More than 18 grams of methamphetamine was discovered in a probationer's car when an **Area 11** parole/probation agent in Pine Bluff (**Area 11**) noticed the offender was behaving nervously when questioned about drug use. The search of the offender's vehicle revealed a baggie containing a large chunk of a white crystal-like substance suspected to be methamphetamine weighing 18.6 grams and a methamphetamine pipe. The offender was taken into custody.

Area 11 Agents Parker and Williams conducted a home visit in Rison and found several items of drug paraphernalia including an amber smoking pipe with bowl and a straight clear smoking pipe, a smoking device made from a glass bottle, a glass smoking device with black birds on it, a red glass smoking device, a glass smoking device shaped like a skull and a small metal smoking pipe. They also found a metal marijuana grinder, a plastic marijuana grinder and a wooden marijuana holder.

An offender who reported to the **Area 8** Office to meet with her parole/probation officer was found to have 6 grams of methamphetamine in her pocket. The drugs were found during a pat-down search.

Area 8's Intensive Parole Supervision team received a

complaint about an offender having a gun and during a home visit in Roland, a 30-30 lever-action rifle with a scope was found in the offender's car. The offender, who had a 3rd Degree Battery warrant out of Pulaski County, as well as a Failure to Appear warrant out of Drew County on felony charges was taken into custody.




Area 8 Officer Nick Smith contacted the Intensive Parole Supervision team stating that he had observed one of his parole absconders at the Days Inn Motel on Fair Park in Little Rock. He requested assistance from IPS to make the arrest. Officer Smith contacted hotel staff and verified that the offender was staying at the hotel and was told that hotel staff suspected drug activity in the room. Once there, officers found a plastic bag containing suspected methamphetamine, marijuana, MDMA, and fentanyl. Little Rock Police Department Narcotics was contacted and they requested and executed a search warrant on the room. All evidence was retained by the Little Rock Police Department. The offender was arrested.



In early June, a joint operation with the Intensive Parole Supervision team, the Little Rock Police Department, Maumelle Police Department, and the DEA resulted in the arrest of an offender and discovery of fentanyl and pink methamphetamine. Charges against the offender are pending.

A large garbage bag filled with marijuana was discovered in an offender's apartment by **Area 8's** Intensive Parole Supervision team. A search of a second apartment used by the offender revealed marijuana and weapons. The offender was found to have 16 pounds of marijuana, 3 firearms, and \$7,830. He was arrested.



Treatment Program Summary:

846 probationers and parolees were served in the general substance use disorder treatment programs. Additionally 885 participants were served in the Drug Court treatment programs, bringing the total served to 1,731.

A total of 523 residents have agreed to participate in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018 - 247 are discharged with follow up in progress in the community and 69 have completed the program. Partnership is in effect with 65 Community Providers to continue MAT upon re-

lease from the Centers.

Substance use disorder groups - 574 participants

Case management - 59 participants

Continuing care - 189 participants

Domestic violence prevention - 3 participants

Life skills - 26 participants

Tobacco use treatment groups -11 participants

Reentry Facilities:

As of June 30, ACC has 7 licensed reentry facilities with a total of 207 residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry Facility Program.

During the month, 23 residents graduated the Reentry program, 37 new residents were transferred into the program, 23 residents started WAGE classes, 20 residents completed WAGE, 17 residents started the Career Readiness Certificate program, 13 residents completed the Career Readiness Certificate program, 3 residents started GED class, and 2 residents received their GED. A total of 20 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 7 received an ID card, 7 received their Social Security card and 9 received birth certificates.

During June, 150 facility residents were reported to be employed and 26 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time.

Reentry officers reported 10 education referrals that

resulted in an education enrollment.

Transitional Housing:

A total of 22 licensed facilities with 414 ACC funded residents.

Within the transitional facilities there are a total of 235 residents who have obtained full time employment, 21 part time employed, 32 receiving disability, and 126 are pending employment and/or left a facility prior to obtaining employment.

This month, 6 residents reported to have enrolled in GED classes and 2 residents completed GED.

A total of 67 registered sex offenders are living in a transitional facility.

A total of 37 residents received their driver's license, 102 received an ID card, 77 received their Social Security card and 48 received birth certificates.

Volunteer Program:

A total of 65 volunteers reported a total of 990 hours during the month within the residential facilities statewide.

Arkansas Works:

During the month there were approximately 248 individuals screened for the Arkansas Works program. A total of 693 individuals submitted an application and 341 enrolled in a "Qualified Health Plan" as reported by Eaton Agency.

Specialized: These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (intensive supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Special Response Team).

Indirect: These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in non-reporting status, those on suspended sentences (SIS), and interstate compact offenders. Offenders on annual supervision are also included in this group.


