From the Director

Congratulations to Krystle Williams on her promotion to Area Manager for **Area 10** Parole and Probation (Garland, Grant, Saline, Clark, Ouachita, Dallas, Calhoun and Hot Spring Counties).

Williams, shown below, has a bachelor of science degree in human services and a master of science degree in clinical mental health counseling, from Henderson State University. She began working as a parole and probation officer for the Division of Community Correction in January 2008. She was promoted to Assistant Area Manager in Area 10 in 2016. She was part of the Drug Endangered Children pilot program and expansion in Area 10. She also assisted with the start of the Alternative Sentencing Program and WAGE being implemented with ACC when she worked in Clark County.



Area 10 Assistant Area Manager Sidra Porchia, who oversees the Camden and Fordyce offices, hosted the “Forever Honoring Zacharia Porchia” 5K Walk/Run Band Scholarship Fundraiser. The 5K run/walk was a fundraiser for a band scholarship for three Camden Fairview High School band students. “It’s in honor of my 15-year-old son, who passed away January 16, 2021. He was a very passionate member of the Camden Fairview High School Band. I hosted this

event in his honor. It’s an event I will host annually,” said Porchia. Working alongside AAM Porchia were volunteers Agent Lesia Marshall and Administrative Assistant Kumari Parker; sponsors Agent Marshall, Drug Court Advisor Lynette Langley, and Substance Abuse Program Leader/Counselor Felisa Tucker; and participants Agents George Barnes and Donovan Harris.

In late November, **Area 2** Career Planning and Placement Specialist Bertha Kitchens set up a job fair in the Mountain Home office with 27 unemployed offenders attending. The following employers were present to answer questions, provide applications, and set up interviews: American Stitch Co., American Epoxy Scientific, Bass Cat, Yar-Craft, Manpower, Tyson, and the Arkansas Department of Workforce Services. The current plan is to continue to hold job fairs in the Mountain Home office every 2 to 3 months.

Kevin Hunt, shown below, came to the **Omega Center** in Malvern to speak to residents about his life from gangs to prison to recovery.



Area 10 Career Planning and Placement Specialist Tammy Rowland took Hot Springs community service workers to the Garland County Landfill to pick up trash.

Community service workers in **Area 5** hung quilts for the Polk County quilt show. Community service workers have participated in this community activity for the past 10 years.

The Work of Parole/Probation Officers and Agents

Area 10 Parole and Probation Officers Justin Stewart, Blake Morris, Kiana Wesley and David Sanford conducted night home visits during November, which enables the officers to meet with offenders who work during the day.

In late November, **Area 2** Agent Lisa Wells, along with other members of the Arkansas Division of Community Correction, 20th Judicial District Drug Task Force, Searcy County Sheriff's Department, and Marshall Police Department, participated in the execution of a search warrant at an offender's residence that resulted in the discovery of 3.5 grams of a white crystalline substance believed to be methamphetamine, approximately 200 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, \$10,088 in cash, a number of additional small baggies of a green leafy substance and a white crystalline substance believed to be packaged for distribution, a set of scales, 35 pills suspected to be Hydrocodone, 22 pills suspected to be Oxycodone, and two glass smoking devices with burnt residue. All items were collected as evidence by the Drug Task Force and the offender was transported to the Searcy County Detention Center.

Officers in **Area 8** found 25 Xanax bars and two handguns (shown below), one of which was a semi-automatic, during a home visit completed with multiple law enforcement agencies. The offender was

taken into custody.

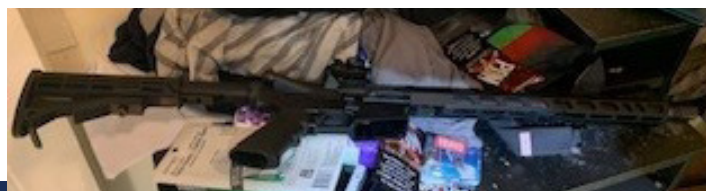
Area 8 officers participated in a multi-agency home visit at an offender's residence and discovered 150 Xanax bars (shown below). The offender was taken into custody.



Officers in **Area 8** found 4 grams of cocaine, 5 grams of methamphetamine, 50 MDMA pills, 30 Xanax pills, black tar heroin, 6 pounds of marijuana and a Glock 9mm handgun during a search of a parolee's home. The home visit was prompted by a tip. The offender was taken into custody.



A multi-agency home visit, including **Area 8** officers, was conducted on an offender's home and an AR-15 rifle and four loaded 223 magazines were discovered. The offender, who was not at home during the visit, was taken into custody when he reported for an office visit later that same day.



Treatment Program Summary:

1,451 parolees and probationers were served in general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs during November. Additionally 1,329 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to 2,780.

A total of 562 residents have agreed to participate in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018; 278 are discharged with follow up in progress in the community and 77 have completed the program. Partnership is in effect with 71 Community Providers to continue MAT upon release from an ACC center, and the program has been extended through September 2022 with peer recovery specialist and transitional housing services added.

An Intensive Case Management pilot program in the North Little Rock office began in September 2021 and currently has 11 participants enrolled. Three have been assisted with temporary housing as needed, eight have been assisted with insurance paperwork with six of those now approved for insurance, two have been assisted with meeting medical needs, two have been helped with meeting mental health needs and four have been helped with gaining employment.

Tobacco Use Treatment - 8 participants

The Washington County Drug Court (**Area 1**) is conducting HIV/Hepatitis education and testing to benefit program participants with help from a grant received by the county.

Reentry Facilities:

As of November 30, ACC has seven licensed reentry facilities with 240 total residents currently in Phases I-IV of the Reentry Facility program. There was a total of 18 reentry graduates this month.

During November, 32 new residents were transferred into the reentry program, 15 residents started WAGE classes, 24 residents completed WAGE, 3 residents

started GED classes, 2 completed GED, 13 residents started the Career Readiness Certificate program and 17 residents completed CRC. A total of 24 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 24 received an ID card, 18 received their Social Security card and 17 received birth certificates.

Reentry Officers:

In November, there were 186 residents who reported to be employed and 28 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry officers reported 9 education referrals which resulted in education enrollment. Reentry officers conducted 196 Reentry Facility office visits, 132 Phase IV office visits, 40 Phase IV home visits, and 65 parole plan verifications. Reentry officers made 36 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and 60 office visits in their area.

Transitional Housing:

There are 21 licensed Transitional Living Facilities with 587 beds - 368 of which are ACC funded.

Within the Transitional Facilities there are 230 residents who have obtained full time employment.

During November, two residents reported to have enrolled in GED classes.

There are 39 registered sex offenders living in a Transitional Facility.

A total of 36 residents received their driver's license, 104 received an ID card, 66 received their Social Security card and 44 received birth certificates.

A total of 48 graduated the transitional housing program, 56 absconded and 19 were dismissed.

Employment:

During the month of November, there were 416 residents reported to have full-time employment within the Reentry and Transitional Facilities.

Arkansas Works:

During the month, there were 425 individuals screened for the Arkansas Works program. There were 763 applications received and 566 who enrolled in a "Qualified Health Plan" as reported by the Eaton Agency.

Specialized: These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (intensive supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Special Response Team).

Indirect: These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in non-reporting status, those on suspended sentences (SIS), and interstate compact offenders. Offenders on annual supervision are also included in this group.

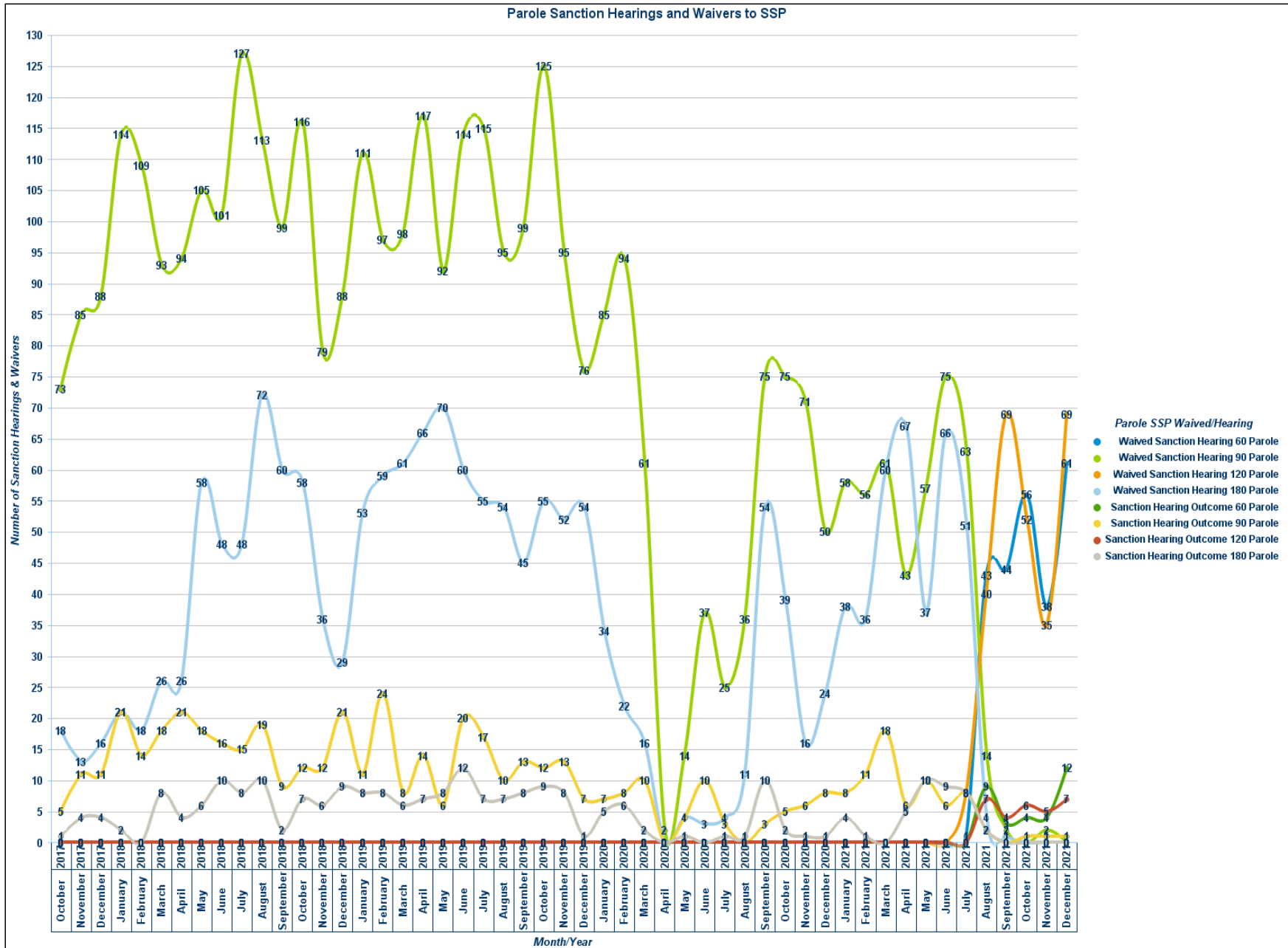
