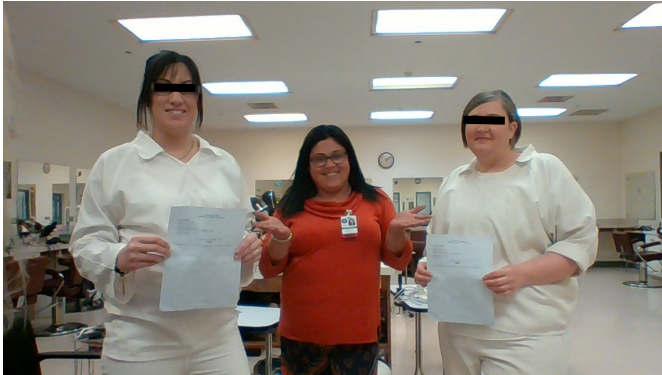

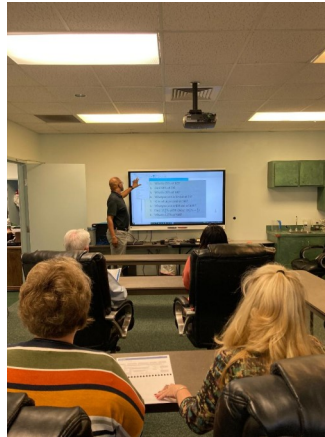

A representative from each of ACSD's sites met at the Central Office on November 4th for 6 hours of technology professional development. Kenneth Andre Rogers, Technology Coordinator, and Tracy Dowell, Deputy Superintendent, provided instruction on Microsoft 365 and SmartBoard. Aztec Education Software reps attended part of the training virtually. Each participant received an Aztec demo link to evaluate the Aztec programs targeted toward low- and mid-level learners.



When school is not in session due to shakedowns or quarantines, each site's representative will provide Microsoft 365 and SmartBoard training to the school staff. All levels of academic instruction will evaluate the Aztec software.

- Tracy Dowell met with Edward Jordan, Arkansas Barber Inspector, at the Grimes Unit on November 29th.
  - Both the classroom and clinical room meet space standards
  - The clinical area will need to be plumbed for 8 shampoo stations
  - A barber instructor will be hired during the spring semester

Warden Gray has submitted a pavilion/seating plan for a staff/visitation waiting area. More pictures will follow as the class continues to work on this project





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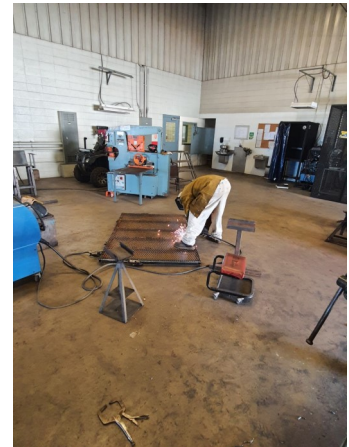

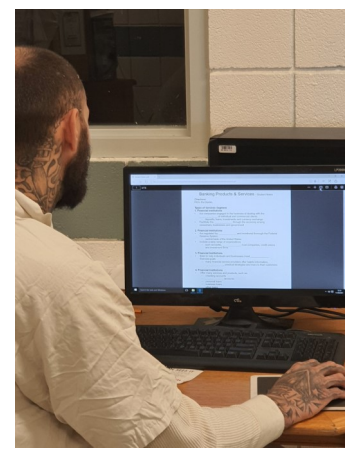
