# From the Director

Congratulations to James Landsdell for his promotion to Assistant Area Manager in **Area 12** Parole/Probation Services.



AAM Landsdell started out in law enforcement as a Corrections Officer at the Bi-State Justice center in Texarkana in July of 2005. In August of 2014, he was hired as a Correctional officer by ACC at the Southwest Community Correction Center. In July of 2015, AAM Landsdell was promoted to Sergeant, and in February of 2016, he was named the training Sergeant of the Southwest Center. In April of 2018, AAM Landsdell was promoted to Lieutenant. In November of 2019 AAM Landsdell transitioned to Parole/Probation Services as a Parole/Probation Officer in the Lewisville Office. While working for the Department, he has participated in multiple testing teams for eOMIS, InTouch, and the probation/parole kiosk. AAM Tyson has served as a Field Training Officer (FTO) while also supervising one of the highest volume transitional facilities in the state. AAM Tyson has a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, and a master's degree in management and leadership from Webster University. A pre-adjudication program called the Craighead County Restoration Court started in **Area 4** in February. It is designed to serve low risk/low need defendants by agreement from Circuit Court. It is a program that provides an alternative disposition of criminal offender's pending felony cases. It allows defendants to mitigate their crimes now so that they do not continue in the criminal justice system in the future. This court is now in full swing and uses Drug Court programs and Cognitive Behavioral Education.

Staff worked with the University of Arkansas Extension Office to present a class on finance and budgeting in mid February in Parole/Probation Services **Area 5**.



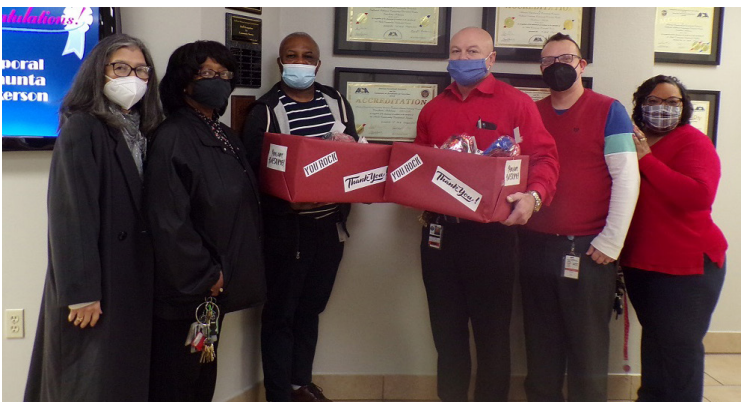
Five participants spent 90 minutes going over how to plan a budget and save money (shown below).



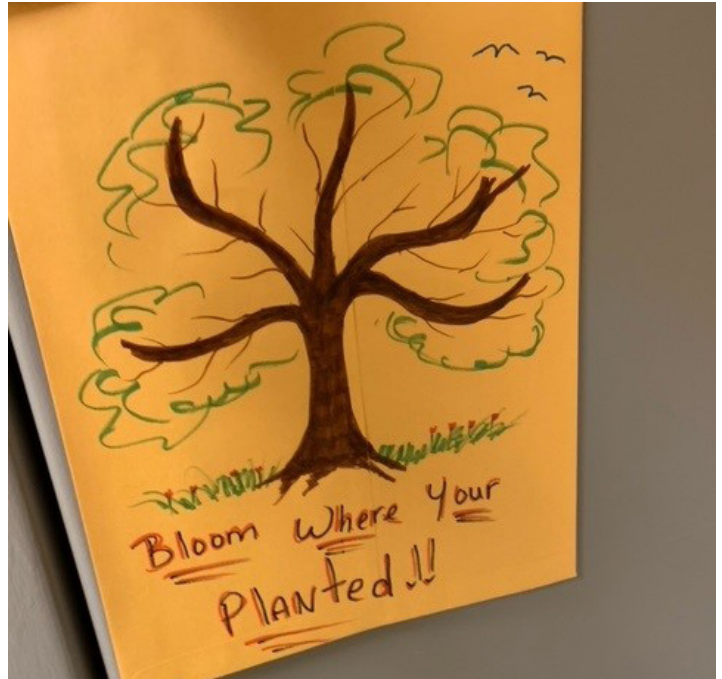

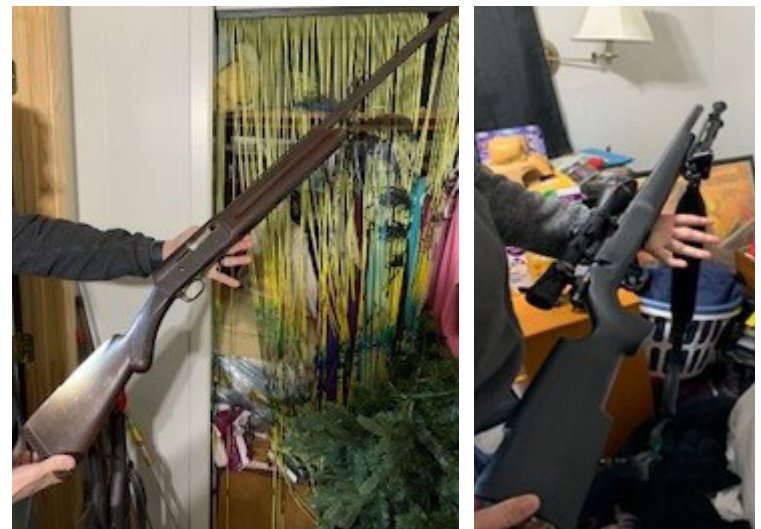

## The Work of Parole/Probation Officers and Agents

**Area 11** Agents found several rifles and ammunition when they conducted a home visit in Ashely County with the Sheriff's Department's assistance. The firearms were confiscated by the Ashley County Sheriff Department. The offender was charged with Possession of a Firearm by Certain Persons, he was incarcerated and a parole hold was placed.



**Area 11** Agents found guns and drugs during a home visit in Crossett. With the help of the Ashley County Sheriff's Department, the offender and another in the home were placed under arrest and charged with Possession of Controlled Substance Schedule I, II (Methamphetamines), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Simultaneous Possession of Drugs and Firearms. Both were transported to the Ashley County Sheriff's Department.

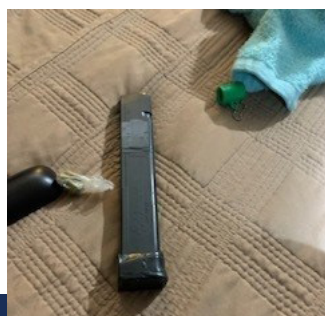
**Area 2** Agent Steve Simers conducted a home visit in Salem and found a plastic baggie containing a white crystalline substance and a small set of digital scales with residue. The offender was transported to Fulton County Detention Center with pending felony charges and a parole hold.

**Area 8** completed a home visit after the Little Rock Police Department surveilled an offender's home and saw multiple illegal narcotics transactions. The offender was taken into custody and approximately 30 fentanyl pills, two stolen firearms, 2 ounces of methamphetamine and 2 ounces of marijuana were discovered.

Four pounds of marijuana and approximately \$4,000 in cash was found during a home visit in Little Rock by **Area 8** Parole/Probation Services Agents. The offender was arrested pending new charges.



Marijuana and an extended magazine for a Glock were discovered during a home visit in Little Rock by **Area 8** Agents. The offender was taken into custody.



Another home visit by **Area 8** Agents resulted in the confiscation of a small amount of suspected methamphetamine. The offender was arrested.

Two ounces of methamphetamine and a half pound of marijuana were discovered on an offender during a home visit by **Area 8** Agents in Little Rock. A handgun was found in the offender's residence. The offender was arrested.

**Area 4** Parole/Probation Officer Ethan McGinnis found three stolen firearms during a home visit on a probationer. Thoroughly searching a home during home visits has become a very important step in enforcing conditions of supervision. These firearms also had high ammo capacity magazines.



A sex offender who was subject to a polygraph/computer voice stress analyzer (CVSA) was found to be deceptive to compliance and sexual contact with minors. Upon post-examination interview, the offender disclosed he was in possession of a smart cellular phone and computer, which he had carefully hidden in his bedroom closet, he was actively using the internet and he was in possession of a sexual doll that he had concealed under his bed. He also was in possession of a shotgun and shells. The offender was arrested and charged with § 5-73-103 Possession of Firearm by Certain Persons, a Class B Felony.



Sex Offender Supervision Assistant Area Manager and Polygraph Examiner/PA Rachel Shuptrine attended the Arkansas Sex Offender Management Association (ASOMA) meeting hosted by ACIC in Little Rock. Participants proposed legislation changes, discussed annual conference with call for speaker nominations, and shared cases from different departments to the group for ideas/suggestions. Attendees ranged from police department secretaries, ACC staff, jail administrators, ACIC staff, and detectives from more than 10 different agencies.

### **Treatment**

#### **Program Summary:**

1,317 probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs. Additionally 1,375 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to 2,692.

A total of 588 residents have agreed to participate in Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018 - 300 were discharged with follow up in progress in the community and 82 have completed the program. Partnerships are in effect with 71 community providers to continue MAT upon release from an ACC center and the program has been extended through September 2022. Transitional Housing services and Peer Recovery Specialists have been added to the MAT program.

Intensive Case Management Pilot Program in the North Little Rock Parole/Probation Office (Area 8) began in September 2021 and currently has 4 participants. Three were assisted with housing, mental health therapy, basic needs and employment.

### **Reentry Facilities**

At the end of February, ACC had seven licensed Reentry Facilities with 189 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry Facility program. There were 43 reentry graduates during February.

During February, 43 new residents were transferred into the Reentry program, 10 residents started WAGE classes, eight residents completed WAGE, and one resident started GED classes. A total of 23 residents started the Career Readiness Certificate program and nine residents completed the program. A total of 26 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 35 received an ID card, eight received their Social Security card and 23 received birth certificates.

### **Reentry Officers**

In February, 134 residents were reported to be employed. Reentry Officers reported 9 education referrals which resulted in education enrollment. Reentry Officers conducted 133 Reentry Facility office visits, 106 Phase IV office visits, 28 Phase IV home visits, and 45 pre parole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 25 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 79 office visits in their area.

### **Transitional Housing**

There are 18 licensed vendor facilities with 418 ACC funded beds within the facilities.

Within the transitional facilities there are 260 residents who have obtained full time employment.

This month, three residents reported to have enrolled in GED Classes. There are 256 residents who reported to have received their GED or high school diploma.

There are 36 registered sex offenders living in a transitional facility.

A total of 17 residents received their driver's license, 73 received an ID card, 34 received their Social Security card and 29 received birth certificates.

A total of 44 graduated the transitional housing program, 43 absconded and 12 were dismissed.

### Non Reporting:

Drug Court offender currently in a Community Correction Center for sanction or court commitment, on detainer (federal or ICE hold), out-of-state, in CCC Residential Treatment, nursing home, hospital, or Arkansas State Hospital.

Out-To-Other-State:

Offender supervised out of Arkansas through Interstate Compact.

### Unsupervised:

Parolee whose earned Good Time has met the requirements for unsupervised parole, probationers who received Unsupervised Sentence (e.g., five-year probation sentence specified as 3 years supervised and an additional 2 years unsupervised probation; or an unsupervised probation sentence which is common for misdemeanor offenses (e.g., 1 year unsupervised probation term).

### Suspended Imposition of Sentence (SIS):

Offender received a suspended term of supervision.

**Regular:** These are officers carrying normal Probation and Parole caseloads.

**Specialty Court:** These officers supervise offenders in specialty courts. Note that these officers may also carry regular P&P offenders, and these offenders are reflected in the specialty court caseload/workload figures; however, separate caseload/workload ratios are calculated for the regular and specialty court portions of a specialty court officer's caseload, in addition to a combined, or mixed, ratio.

**Specialized:** These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (intensive supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Special Response Team).

**Indirect:** These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in non-reporting status, those on suspended sentences (SIS), and interstate compact offenders. Offenders on annual supervision are also included in this group.

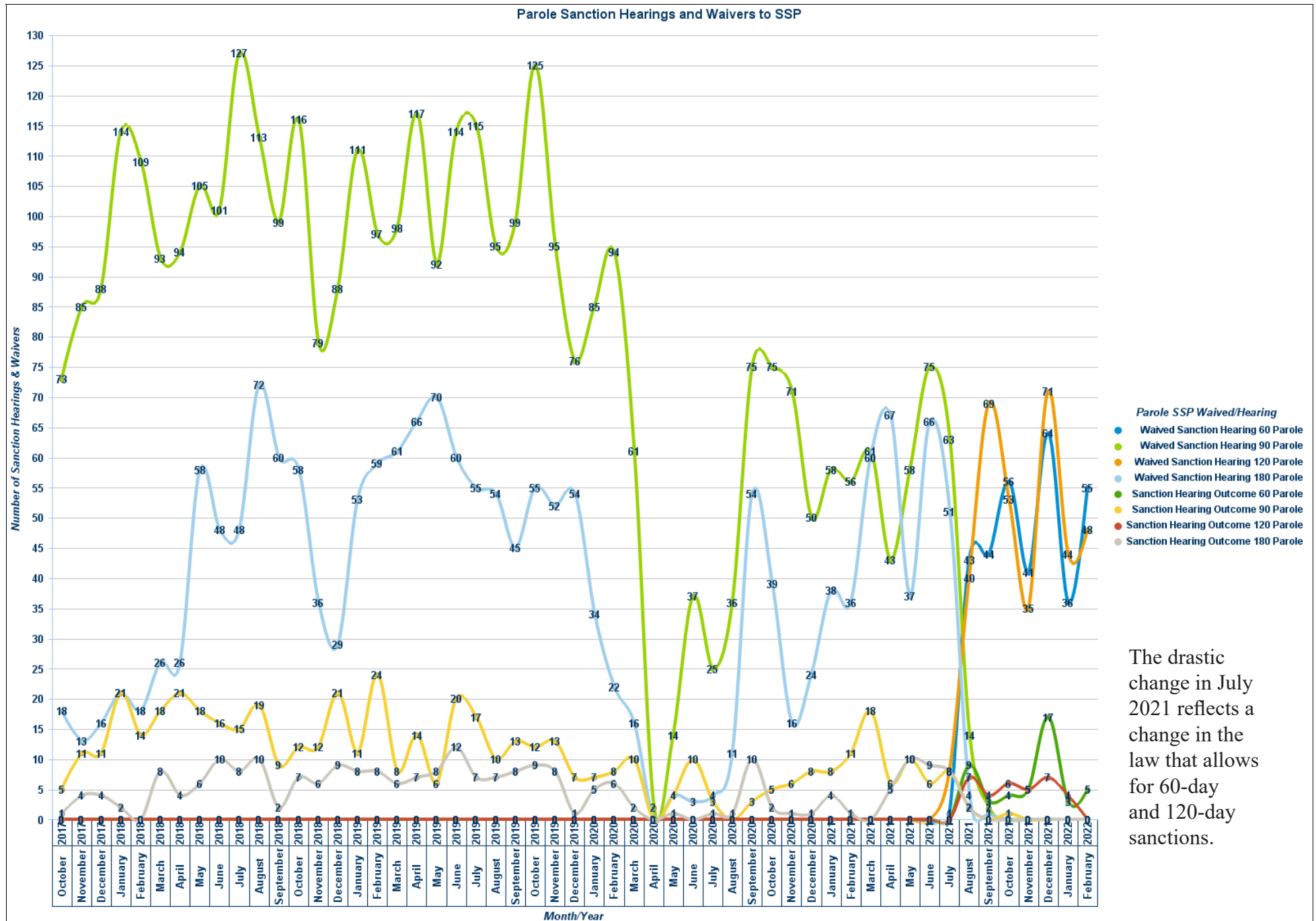
