COMMUNITY SUPERVISION AREA HIGHLIGHTS:

AREA 1

On June 11, 2025, DEA Task Force Officer/Agent Craig Foreman of the Arkansas Department of Corrections (Division of Community Correction, Community Supervision Services, Area 1 Benton County), participated in an operational and tactical briefing in preparation for the execution of a search warrant being conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). On June 11, 2025, at approximately 0800 hours, DEA personnel established surveillance at the aforementioned address. Surveillance was maintained for approximately four hours. During that time, TERRY departed the residence on a motorcycle. DEA personnel, in coordination with a marked units from the Washington County Sheriff's Office (WCSO), conducted a traffic stop away from the residence. TERRY was detained pursuant to the execution of the active search warrant. Following the detention, DEA personnel from the FRO, assisted by WCSO marked units, executed the search warrant at the residence. A unified warrant team consisting of DEA Agents, Task Force Officers, and WCSO Deputies conducted the entry and subsequent search. The search of the residence, specifically the master bedroom closet, resulted in the seizure of the following items:

- Approximately 104.3 gross grams of cocaine
- Numerous small plastic baggies commonly used for packaging/distribution of narcotics
- One (1) black CZ Scorpion EVO 3 pistol with a 19-round magazine loaded with 9mm ammunition
- One (1) black/tan Springfield Armory pistol with a 13-round magazine loaded with .45 caliber ammunition

 Demetrius TERRY was transported to the Washington County

 Detention Center, where he was formally arrested and charged with the following offenses:
- Possession with Purpose to Deliver Cocaine
- Simultaneous Possession of Drugs and Firearms Federal indictment will be sought in this case pending charging decision from the United States Attorney's Office of the Western District of Arkansas..

AREA 2

On June 13, Agents Cody Bruyette and Zach Perry conducted a home visit pursuant to a phone call received which indicated that a parolee may be holding a female in his residence and causing her physical harm. Local law enforcement was advised of the allegations and reported to the reported residence of the offender. Sheriff's deputies arrived at the residence first

and were unable to make contact though loud music could be heard inside the residence. Officers tried several methods to have the offender come out of residence and were eventually successful. The female subject was interviewed by an investigator, and it was determined that the offender had caused enough physical harm that she would require medical attention. A search was conducted inside the residence which yielded the discovery of several items of drug paraphernalia used for methamphetamine and marijuana and a loaded firearm. The parolee was taken into custody and has been charged with Kidnapping, a class Y felony, as well as other felonies and misdemeanors related to the offense. AREA 3

On July 12, 2025, Sharp County Drug Court celebrated their first drug court graduate since the drug court began in 2022. Tara Taylor graduated the program and was presented with a certificate

as well as a plaque. She spoke about how the program and Drug Court Team had helped her and most importantly, gave her back her relationship with her child. Many members of the Sharp County community were there to celebrate the graduation.

AREA 4

On 06/24/25 Area 4 Jonesboro Officer Christopher Shaver spoke to the Phase I participants in the Poinsett County Drug Court. Officer Shaver is a Veteran who served in the U.S. Army from September 2003 to November 2007. He was officially stationed in Alaska but was deployed to Iraq in 2005 and 2006. Officer Shaver related how drug usage and abuse was rampant in all areas of the military and he gave first-hand recollections of what he witnessed during his years of service. He gave excellent antidotes to recovery and the undeniable truth that recovery is possible. There was a Q & A sesseion at the end and he spoke candidly to the group about his experiences. Thank you Officer Shaver for your service!

AREA 7/8

On 6/25/25, ISP Agents received a call from LRPD narcotics detectives for information on offender Fletcher Berkley. Agents informed detectives that offender Berkley was an active absconded parolee, and he was detained. A search of his person was and the vehicle he was in was searched and narcotics and drug paraphernalia were discovered. Berkley and another female named Jaleah Miller were transported to the southwest substation for questioning. Berkley was charged with Trafficking a controlled substance, Possession of Sch II Cocaine, and Tampering with physical evidence.

AREA 9

06/20/2025 - a home visit conducted on this date by Agent Ashanti Burris and Agent Megan Scroggins at the address of 413 E. 3rd Ave, Foreman, Arkansas the residence of Robert Carter, PID# 412.985. Inside of the bedroom, a search was conducted. An iPad was observed at the top of the headboard in the bedroom in which the pad was in airplane mode. Two cellphones (Samsung smartphones) were observed on the brown smaller table near the dual screen desktop and monitor. Those cellphones were previewed in which no violation was observed on the phones. Agents observed a dual screen desktop. Agents previewed the computer to search for any violations. A Discord account was found that was not registered on his sex offender registration. The direct messages were reviewed by Agents on this account. It appeared that Carter may have been having conversations with minors. Also, while previewing the computer in his file, agents observed numerous pornographic pictures and videos of minor children as well as implicit stories. Little River County Sheriff Office was notified by agents. Upon their arrival the case was turned over to them. Robert Carter was transported to Little River County Jail and charged with Child Pornography. After returning to Little River County Sheriff's Office,

CSA Mendy Johns and CSO Cornelius Gregory conducted a home visit at the residence 2601 County Club Rd. Apt 3 Arkadelphia, AR 71923 Clark County, Johnny E. Dickerson. Officer Gregory located a handgun Taurus 9mm(loaded) laying near the front door. Once the weapon was found, Dickerson was advised he would be going to jail for Possession of a Firearm by certain persons. Officers contacted Arkadelphia PD to assist with the arrest of Johnny Dickerson. The Officer with the PD, took possession of the firearm and stated he would complete his report

AREA 11

Department in conducting a search of offender James Hogue PID 0083246 property in order to look for a stolen vehicle. Agents Parker and Johnson met with Chief McFatridge at the Redfield Police Department and the Agents along with Lt. Rich Debill, patrolman Brandon Legros and Cheif McFatridge of the Redfield Police Department went to offender Hogues listed residence. Agents Johnson, Parker and Chief McFatridge went to the front door while Debill and Legros went to the back of the house. A woman answered the door who identified herself as Offender Hogues wife. Chief McFatridge showed her a copy of the warrantless search waiver and informed her they were looking for Hogue. She initially denied that offender Hogue was there but after further questioning she admitted offender Hogue was in the back yard a few moments ago. Agent Parker and Chief McFatridge entered the residence to clear it and make sure he was not still inside the residence while Agent Johnson went to the back yard. Agent Parker began to clear rooms and located a locked door. Agent Parker asked her what the room was and she stated that it was offender Hogues bedroom. Agent Parker alerted Chief McFatridge that he was most likely in that room and after several verbal commands for offender Hogue to come to the door went unanswered they asked where the key was and why it was locked. She stated she did not know but they usually open it with a butter knife. She retrieved a butter knife and attempted to open it but was unable to do so then handed it to Chief McFatridge who was able to open the door. Once inside Agent Parker and Chief McFatridge went to the bathroom and discovered it was locked and began giving verbal commands for offender Hogue to come out. Offender Hogue replied he was using the bathroom and would be out in a moment. Agent Parker then alerted Agent Johnson and the officers outside that offender Hogue was in the bathroom. For approximately 3 minutes Agent Parker and Chief Hogue continued to give verbal commands for offender Hogue to come out before he finally opened the door. Agent Parker placed him in hand restraints and conducted a pat search and took custody of him while Agent Johnson went into the bathroom and began a search. In an igloo container on a pile of clothes in the walk in shower Agent Johnson found multiple smoking pipes used for smoking methamphetamines, multiple bags of syringes, a jar with 34 grams of shrooms and multiple bags of a crystal like substance and two vials of a liquid substance. A search was begun by Agents and officers at that time. In a safe in the closet Agent Parker found a small box of .22 long rifle and four pistol grips. In a nightstand next to the bed Agent Parker located a syringe with a liquid inside. In the bathroom Agent Parker located a jar with a crystal like substance. Cheif McFatridge found a flare gun. Agent Johnson located two bags of various types of ammunition in a back bedroom. The evidence was collected by the Redfield police department. The crystal like substance was weighed and tested. It tested positive for 74 grams of methamphetamines and fentanyl. Hogue was transported to the Jefferson county Jail where he was charged with trafficking a controlled substance, possession of fentanyl with purpose to deliver, possession of a controlled substance with purpose to deliver (Shrooms), possession of methamphetamines with intent to deliver and possession of drug paraphernalia. The liquids found are pending testing and more charges June follow.

TREATMENT:

2,131 probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs. Another 1,501 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to 3,632 for the month.

REENTRY PROGRAM:

REENTRY FACILITIES:

As of June 31, ACC had six licensed Reentry Facilities with 188 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry program. Since the program began, there have been 3,363 individuals who have successfully completed and graduated from the program. During the month, nine (9) residents completed WAGE. eight (8) residents completed CRC with fifty eight (58) enrolling, and (7) residents enrolled in GED. A total of thirteen (13) Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, twenty six (26) received an ID card, twenty four (24) received their Social Security Cards and nineteen (19) received birth certificates.

REENTRY PROGRAM CONTINUED:

REENTRY OFFICERS:

In June, 182 Reentry residents was reported to be employed and 41 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported sixteen (16) education referrals, which resulted in enrollments.

Reentry Officers conducted 236 reentry facility office visits, 183 Phase IV office visits, 43 Phase IV home visits and 74 preparole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 40 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 221 office visits in their area. There was three (3) Good Grid classes conducted across the state with ten (10) referrals and thriteen (13) in attendance. Two (2) job fairs were held with 10 referrals aand 19 in attendance.



TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

There are 15 licensed vendor facilities with 544 beds (455 DOC funded) in the facilities. Within the transitional facilities, there are 235 residents who have obtained full-time employment. In June, 307 residents who previously received their GED or high school diploma.

During the month, there were 32 registered sex offenders living in transitional facilities.

A total of 10 residents received their driver's license, 98 received an ID card, 126 received their Social Security card and 17 received birth certificates. Through new community partnerships, one (1) was enrolled in GED.

A total of 69 residents graduated from the Transitional Housing program, 30 absconded and 22 were dismissed.




