COMMUNITY SUPERVISION AREA HIGHLIGHTS:

AREA 2

On February 1, agents and officers assisted the Izard County Sheriff's Department in conducting a home visit/search warrant of an address of an absconded offender and two other occupants. Approximately 15 grams of suspected methamphetamine was discovered as well as numerous items of drug paraphernalia and a loaded .38 Special caliber Smith & Wesson revolver. All three occupants of the residence were taken into custody by the Izard County Sheriff's Department.

AREA 3

On February 28, home visits were conducted in Jackson and Woodruff Counties due to narcotics trafficking. DCC officers assisted the Newport Police Department in apprehend several offenders that had warrants issued for them. During the day, search warrants were served confiscating 13 firearms, approximately 8-9 pounds of methamphetamine, marijuana, drug paraphernalia, and suspected fentanyl being taken off the streets of Jackson County.

AREA 4

On February 27, the Trumann Police Department, Poinsett County Sheriffs Department, and DCC conducted an operation that resulted in numerous arrests. There was 65 grams of Methamphetamine, four arrest warrants were served, 12.2 grams of Schedule IV pills, a glass pipe, scales, and needle were all seized. There were a total of 9 suspects arrested during this operation.

AREA 8

On February 13, an offender reported to parole and was advised that a search was going to be conducted of his vehicle. The offender was detained for officer safety.

During the vehicle search, agents located a large amount of currency, prescription pills and suspected Fentanyl in the trunk. The currency was located in a bag and box in the car and the fentanyl was located in the trunk hidden between the carpet panel and the fender. The offender was then transported to his residence. At the residence, agents made contact with two female offenders and another female. Due to the amount of drug paraphrenia in plain sight, LRPD requested a search warrant of the residence. The additional search of the residence yielded suspected Methamphetamine, Black Tar Heroin, Numerous Pills, Fentanyl, and 3 handguns located in a possible stolen SUV under the carport. Items found total located/seized- 61 grams fentanyl, 3.5 grams meth, 54 grams marijuana, 60 grams alprazolam, 20.5 Adderall tablets, 29.5 dilaudid tablets, 3 guns, and \$22,836.00.

AREA 11

On February 14, an offender arrived for a visit as scheduled and was detained while agents conducted a search of his vehicle where a black ledger was found inside. The offender was then transported for a search of his listed residence. During the search of a bedroom, a 32 caliber Smith and Wesson revolver and a Black in color handgun (Smith and Wesson 9MM Shield) and a gun box were found. Another gun case also on the shelf and located

a silver in color handgun (Hellwin 9MM auto) were located with no magazine in the weapon. Agents were unable to make the Hellwin safe due to slide being seized and the Hellwin handgun was placed back in the case. Agents located the rifle case and removed a Remington 700 Muzzleloader with a scope on it. After all the weapons were made safe, the search of the bedroom continued. The first drawer of the nightstand was opened where agents found 3 digital scales, a Ziplock box with US currency and plastic bags, an Altoids tin container containing 32 blue in color square pills (Suspected to be Fentanyl), 3 plastic baggies containing a white powdery substance and 1 baggy containing a blue powdery substance (Unknown substance suspected to be powder fentanyl). Upon opening the top right drawer of another dresser, 3 bundles of US currency folded in half with a rubber band around them were discovered. In the closet, a bulge at the bottom of a hanging garment bag concealed a one-gallon plastic bag containing a white color block (Suspected to be Cocaine). A black wool coat was found where in the inside of the right-side pocket contained US currency wrapped in rubber bands. In the other side of the coat (Left inside pocket) contained loose US currency. All the contraband was placed on the mattress of the bed. Jefferson County Sheriff Deputy and Jefferson County Drug Task Force arrived on the scene. The Drug task force cataloged and collected the evidence on the mattress. After all the contraband was collected the agents lifted up the mattress and noticed what looked like a shotgun under the frame. Upon further search under the frame of the front right-side, a shotgun (Mossburg 12 gauge), handgun (Ruger 40 caliber) and a safe. Agents ejected 3 12 gauge shotgun shells from the shotgun and removed the magazine from the handgun and pulled the slide to the rear and locked it in place. The shotgun and handgun with the ammo were turned over to the Drug Task Force. The offender was then instructed to open the safe by the investigator which he did and located six bundles of 100 dollar bills inside. Investigators then went into the kitchen and continued the search. A crown royal

bag was found in one cupboard containing 3 small bags of suspected crack, 2 suspected bags of cocaine and one small bag of suspected marijuana. In another cupboard, a suspected bag of cocaine was located. In a separate cupboard, a bag containing 5 large bags of suspected marijuana. The investigator then retrieved the ledger and phone from the offenders vehicle. The offender was then taken into custody by officers and transported to Dub Brassell Detention Facility where he booked in for committing the offenses of possession of 5 counts controlled substance with purpose and simultaneous possession of drugs and firearms. The evidence was weighed as the weights are as follows: \$60,000 dollars in cash, 249.6 Grams of Cocaine, 41.6 Grams of Crack, 166.3 Grams of Marijuana, 37.5 Grams of Methamphetamine, 1.9 Grams of an unknown substance suspected to be Fentanyl, 32 Blue pills of suspected Fentanyl, 5 Zanax bars, and 6 weapons that were found.

SEX OFFENDER SERVICES

Dozens of sex offenders arrested in Benton County – KHBS

Law enforcement agencies in Benton County arrested more than two dozen registered sex offenders during a recent compliance check. Twelve agencies took part in the operation. Out of the more than 260 people they checked, 29 were found to have been violating some kind of regulation. Those included things like not living at their registered address or having a child in the home who was not supposed to be there. Joshua Robinson, the Benton County Prosecutor, praised the operation. “The guys who are supervising these people on a day to day basis do a fantastic job,” he said.

Robinson stressed the effort wasn't a one-time thing, saying “this is not to make up for something that's not being done.” Instead, he said, “it's just meant to augment and kind of focus in a short period of time to pool our resources and do as much as we can.” Law enforcement officials said they're waiting on 21 requests for arrest warrants on this group of sex offenders. They also seized 25 electronic devices officials said they planned to search.

TREATMENT:

PROGRAM SUMMARY

2,560 probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs. Another 1,605 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to 4,165 for the month.

A total of 877 residents have agreed to participate in Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018 with a total of 185 discharged with follow up in the community in progress and a total of 158 have completed the program. Partnerships are in effect with 80 community providers to continue MAT upon release from an ACC center. In February, there were 42 active participants in the Telehealth program implemented in January 2023.

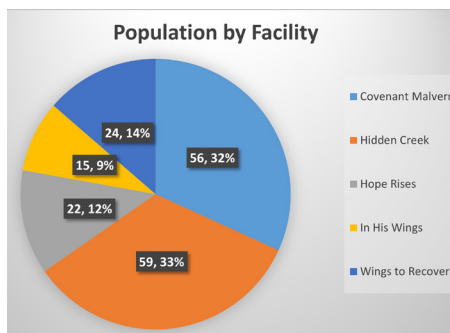
Treatment supervisors reported combined 255 hours of direct clinical supervision with Treatment staff in 32 Community Correction locations.

REENTRY PROGRAM:

REENTRY FACILITIES:

As of February 29, ACC had five licensed Reentry Facilities with 176 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry program. Since the program began, there have been over 3,000 individuals who have successfully completed and graduated from the program.

During the month, 20 residents started the Career Readiness



Certificate program and 16 residents completed the program. A total of 16 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 19 received an ID card, 27 received their Social Security card and 10 received birth certificates.

REENTRY OFFICERS:

In February, 112 Reentry residents were reported to be employed and 39 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported one education referral, which resulted in enrollments.

Reentry Officers conducted 149 reentry facility office visits, 82 Phase IV office visits, 24 Phase IV home visits and 40 pre-parole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 47 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 51 office visits in their area.

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

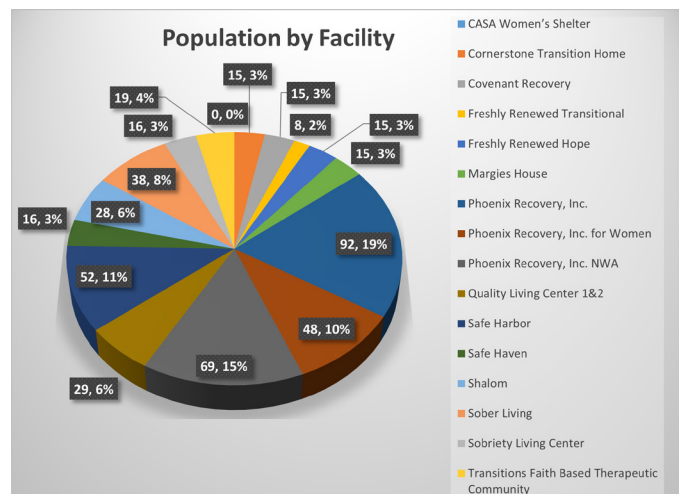
There are 18 licensed vendor facilities with 589 beds (475 ACC-funded) in the facilities. Within the transitional facilities, there are 274 residents who have obtained full-time employment.

In February, 292 residents who previously received their GED or high school diploma.

During the month, there were 48 registered sex offenders living in transitional facilities.

A total of 25 residents received their driver's license, 114 received an ID card, 115 received their Social Security card and 34 received birth certificates.

A total of 60 residents graduated from the Transitional Housing program, 44 absconded and 32 were dismissed.

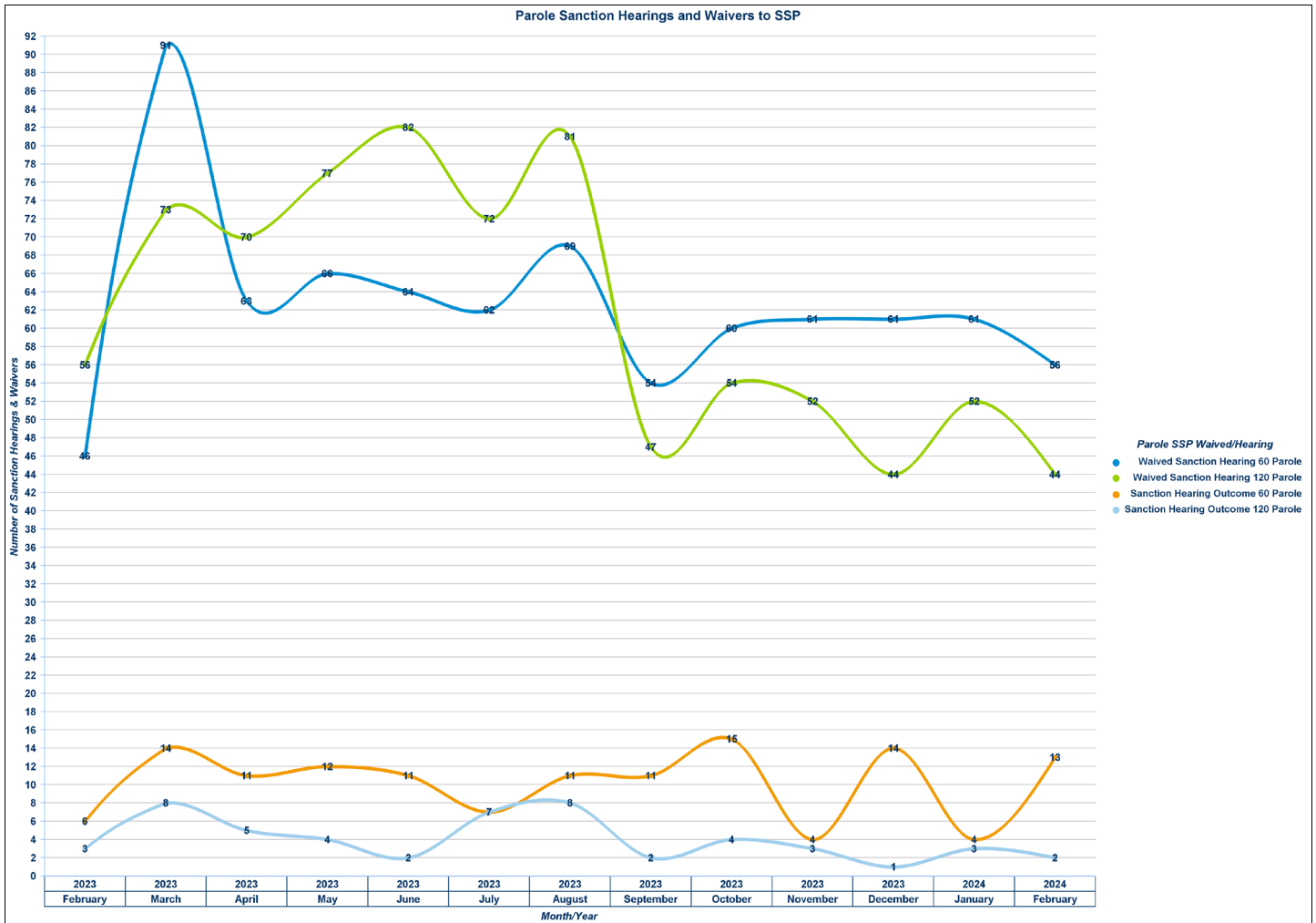
