# PAROLE/PROBATION AREA HIGHLIGHTS:

#### AREA 2

On April 11, an Agent, assisted by investigators from the Izard County Sheriff's Department, conducted a home visit on a parolee. The parolee and other occupants refused to answer the door. A stolen UTV was found on the property, and a search warrant was obtained for the residence. The parolee and his wife were located inside the residence along with an unrelated juvenile.

The wife admitted to having a firearm in her purse and attempted to grab her purse when being taken into custody. The reported firearm and drug paraphernalia were discovered in the residence.

#### AREA 4

An ACC Agent was named the Specialty Court Officer of the Year at the Arkansas Specialty Court Conference in Little Rock. During the conference, there were classes on recidivism, incentives, sanctions and best practice standards.

The Craighead County Drug Court held a graduation on April 25. There were 5 graduates with two (2) of them completing the program with honors, meaning they did not receive a single sanction while in the program.

From April 25 to April 27, a large scale, multijurisdictional team of law enforcement agents, including several ACC Agents, conducted a Sex Offender Compliance Operation in Craighead County. During the operation, 12 firearms were confiscated and 34 people were arrested. Charges included firearm possession, drug possession, and failure to comply with sex offender registration requirements. One person is pending investigation for possession of child sexual abuse material. Eight (8) additional warrants are being sought for fugitive sex offenders.

#### AREA 6

On April 18, an Agent received information regarding an offender out of Russellville selling LSD to minors. He, along with Yell

County Sheriff's Department Officers conducted a home visit and found approximately 434 doses of LSD, 8.6 grams of fentanyl, 5 Lbs. of psilocybin mushrooms and 5.2 lbs. of THC products.

#### AREA 8

ISP was requested to assist State Police Crimes Against Children with a pickup order for the one-year-old child of a parolee. There were reports that he may have teen runaways with him who were being trafficked. Contact was made with the parolee at The Cottages Apartments based on his GPS. He was detained, and the child was removed from a vehicle. Additionally, one juvenile teenage female was located. She was reported as a runaway and was taken into custody for interview and returned to family by CACD. The parolee was released. Investigation is ongoing.

ISP Agents received credible information that a parole absconder was living at an unregistered address and was involved in narcotic activity. Upon arrival at the residence, the absconder was in the front yard and taken into custody. Several other people were located inside the residence, including a parole absconder, a probation absconder, and an active parolee. A search of the residence was conducted, and numerous items of drug paraphernalia were located. A search warrant was obtained and inside a safe officers found approximately 3 ounces of methamphetamine, fentanyl, and a loaded firearm. All evidence was retained by the Little Rock Police Department. The absconder is facing five new felony charges. The parole absconder was held on outstanding warrants. The probation absconder was released with reporting instructions.

#### **SEX OFFENDER SERVICES**

April was Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Month. Area Manager Jennifer Dean Jordan submitted information and training opportunities to Sex Offender Officers statewide.

On Tuesday, April 25, Comprehensive Law Enforcement Teams from the participating Agencies began conducting consent searches at identified registered sex offenders' residences. The visits to registered sex offenders' homes ensured proper registration as required by Arkansas State Law, which served to promote community safety endeavors. Targets included 120 registered sex offenders in Craighead County with an emphasis on moderate to high-risk sex offenders and those under the supervision of ACC.

During the Operation, Agents conducted on-scene forensic triages of over thirty (30) cellular phones, computers, digital storage data devices, and gaming devices. Agents confiscated at least (16) devices and executed multiple search warrants and/or preservation letters for unregistered social media accounts.

Additionally and of great importance, twelve (12) firearms were confiscated and removed from felons who unlawfully possessed them. Two at-large sex offenders were apprehended with warrants served for failure to comply with sex offenders registration requirements.

Agents arrested or cited thirty-four (34) people during the Operation (one not pictured). Those arrested were charged with various offenses, including firearm possession, drug possession, and failure to comply with sex offender registration requirements. One person is pending investigation for possession of child sexual abuse material. Eight (8) additional warrants are being sought for fugitive sex offenders.

#### RESIDENTIAL SERVICES:

# CENTRAL ARKANSAS COMMUNITY CORRECTION CENTER (CACCC)

CAC had crews out on North Shackleford Road helping residents in the area clean up debris from

#### TREATMENT

#### **PROGRAM SUMMARY**

1,621 probationers and parolees were served in the general Substance Use Disorder Treatment programs. Another 1,600 participants were served in the Drug Court Treatment programs, bringing the total served to 3,221 for the month.

A total of 786 residents have agreed to participate in Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) since the program started in July 2018. A total of 476 were discharged with follow up in the community in progress and 128 have completed the program.

Partnerships are in effect with 78 community providers to continue MAT upon release from an ACC center. AFMC a local non-profit organization offers peer support services to participants as needed.

An Intensive Case Management pilot program in the North Little Rock Parole/Probation Office (Area 8) began in September 2021 has discharged one participant and currently has one active participant with mental health, substance abuse and basic needs services.

In April, there were 38 active participants in the newly implemented Telehealth program.

#### AREA 1:

As part of community service, Madison County Treatment Court participants assisted in the cleaning and preparation of a former Skating Rink for a community greenhouse. The owner of the property approved the team to build and maintain a Community Aquaponic Garden.

A local Community Support Recovery Group facilitated a Bridge the Gap meeting with Washington

County Treatment Court participants. Plan is to make it a recurrent meeting every other month.

#### AREA 3:

In Searcy, 19 Treatment Court participants worked closely with Master Gardeners Club at Pioneer Village in Searcy to clean up the grounds for an upcoming open house.

#### AREA 5:

A 2020 graduate of Mena Treatment Court was awarded the 2023 Transformation Award and gave a speech at the 2023 Specialty Courts Conference. Advisor for Treatment Court in Ozark was also awarded Specialty Court Treatment Professional of the Year.

#### AREA 6:


Clinical Supervisor and Treatment Court in Conway began a coordination process for a Peer Summit training with MidSouth Partners with the goal of extending the training to all treatment staff in the Area. The team and state Treatment Courts Coordinator also held a Zoom meeting with American University in a partnership effort to submit a program enhancement grant.

#### REENTRY PROGRAM:

#### **REENTRY FACILITIES:**

As of April 30, ACC had six licensed Reentry Facilities with 186 total residents in Phases I-IV of the Reentry program. Since the program began, a total of 2,875 individuals have successfully completed and graduated from the program. There was a total of 23 reentry graduates during the month.

During the month, 25 new residents were transferred into the Reentry program, 10 residents started the Career Readiness Certificate



program and 12 residents completed the program. A total of 27 Reentry Facility residents received their driver's license, 7 received an ID card, 23 received their Social Security card and 2 received birth certificates.

#### **REENTRY OFFICERS:**

In April, 137 Reentry residents were reported to be employed and 28 residents were reported to be ineligible for employment at this time. Reentry Officers reported six education referrals, which resulted in enrollments.

Reentry Officers conducted 165 reentry facility office visits, 93 Phase IV office visits, 19 Phase IV home visits and 21 pre-parole plan verifications. Reentry Officers made 43 community contacts within their assigned area during the month and conducted 49 office visits in their area.

#### TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

There are 20 licensed vendor facilities with 593 beds (510 ACC-funded) in the facilities.


Within the transitional facilities, there are 228 residents who have obtained full-time employment.

In , 309 residents who previously received their GED or high school diploma.

During the month, there were 38 registered sex offenders living in transitional facilities.

A total of 21 residents received their driver's license, 113 received an ID card, 119 received their Social Security card and 20 received birth certificates.

A total of 70 residents graduated from the Transitional Housing program, 62 absconded and 34 were dismissed.

Note that these officers may also carry regular P/P offenders, and these offenders are reflected in the specialty court caseload/workload figures; however, separate caseload/workload ratios are calculated for the regular and specialty court portions of a specialty court officer's caseload, in addition to a combined, or mixed, ratio.

**Specialized:** These officers supervise strategically specialized caseloads consisting of offenders requiring heightened supervision protocols (intensive supervision) and parolees who have absconded supervision (Special Response Team).

**Indirect:** These are offenders for whom their sentence, circumstance, or current status is associated with a reduced supervision obligation for the officers they are assigned to. Generally, these include offenders in non-reporting status, those on suspended sentences (SIS), and interstate compact offenders. Offenders on annual supervision are also included in this group.


