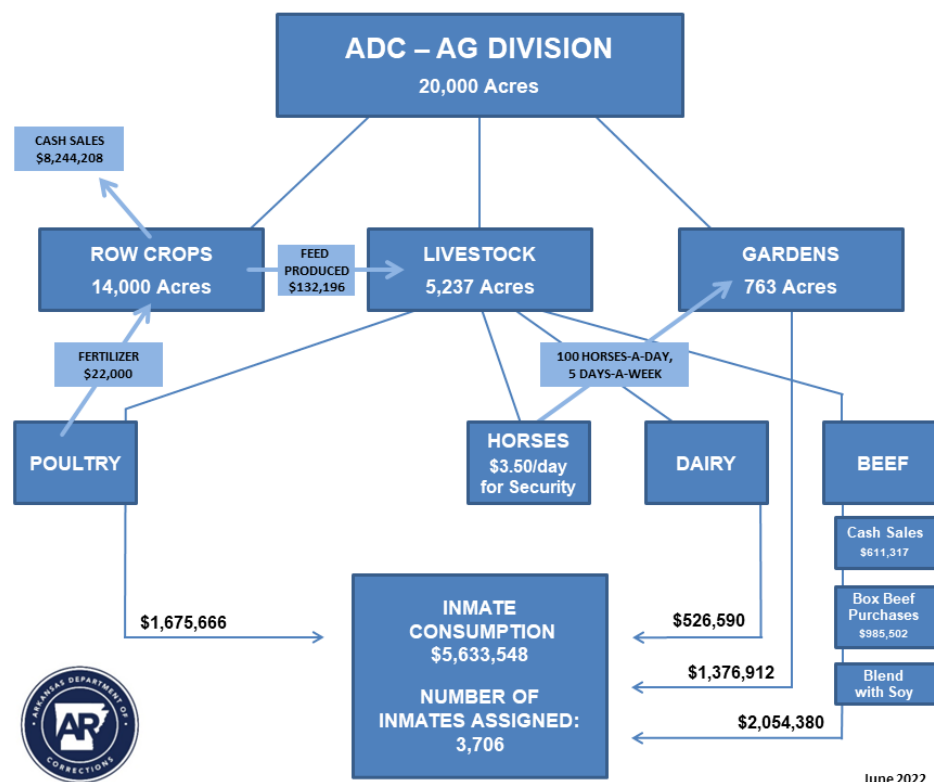

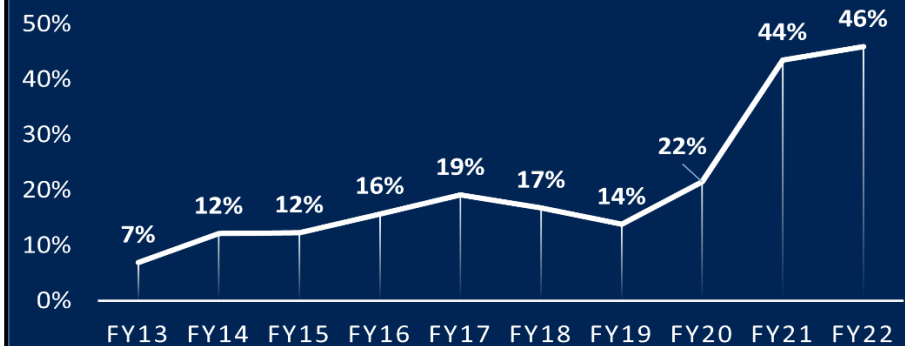

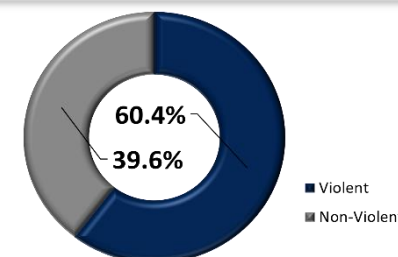

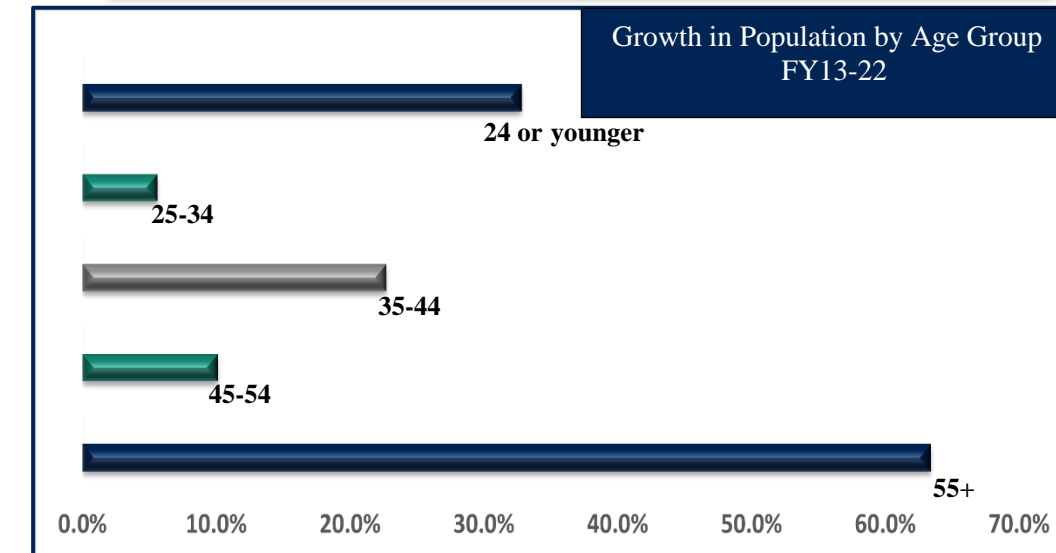

Offense Type (%)



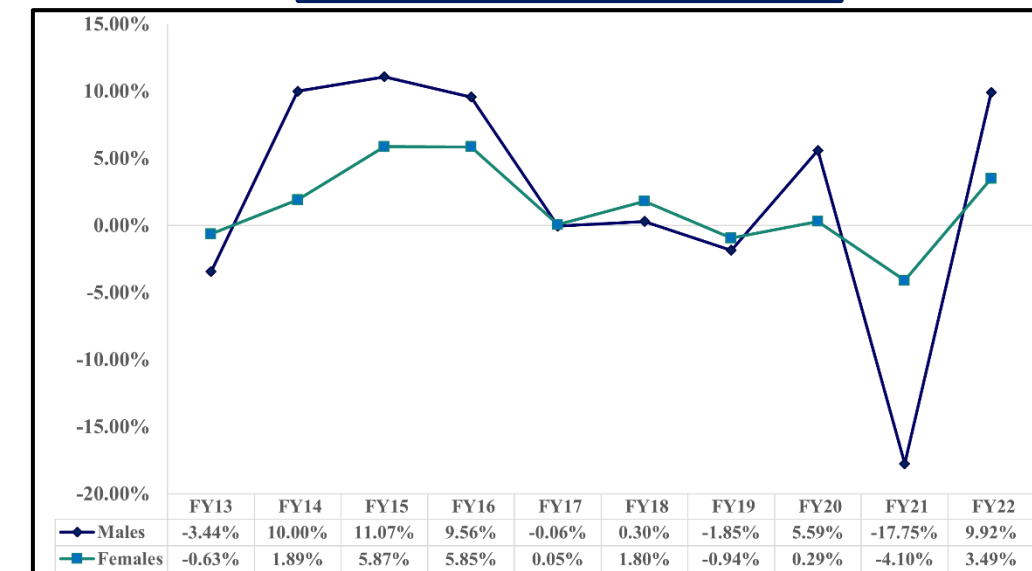

Comparative Look



Statistically, the risk of recidivism decreases significantly with age, yet the number of elderly inmates (age 55+) continues to be the fastest growing age group. They represent 14.5% of the ADC Population and have had a growth rate of 63.4% over the past decade.

Average Growth Rate by Gender



As depicted on the chart above, both male and female inmates saw an increase in growth rate during FY2022.
