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Arkansas Correctional School District Barber School

Barber school began at Grimes on January 22nd. The 1500 barber school curriculum requires instruction in sanitation, related sciences, barber chemical services, barber shop management, salesmanship and product knowledge, hair styling and waving, haircutting and bobbing, and shop deportment.



History of the GED

The first GED test was developed in 1942 to help veterans complete their high school education. It was designed to measure student performance in English, math, science, social studies, and reading. The original version of the test remained substantially unchanged until 1972. The 1972 edition required a broader level of academic skills and a higher level of critical thinking skills, but the main skills measured were literacy and basic math.

The test was revised in 1988 to include a written essay. The test taker was given a topic and had to write approximately 200 words to defend an opinion on an issue. Sixty-five percent of test takers during this time were hoping to use the credential to enter college.

The next major revision was done in 2002 when more business-related topics were covered and the written passages were more relevant to adults.

The most drastic revision occurred in 2014 when the test was reduced to four subject areas: Reasoning through Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. The test was administered on computer. Teachers and administrators generally agree that the 2024 test was, and is, substantially more difficult than the past versions and this was demonstrated in the pass rate for the first several years on the new test.
