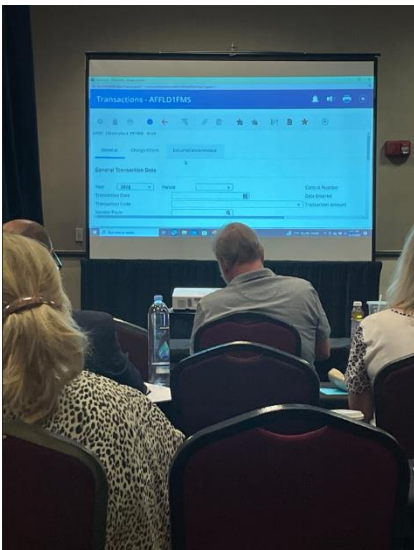


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RLW: Mr. Kendrick's Landscape Construction and Design class planted shrubs at the Central Office.
